FOREWORD BY LEAD PASTOR

Enabling Ministries Through Partnership as AIC Plainsview celebrates 50 years of God's faithfulness in Ministry- Romans 16 :1-27

Romans 16 is Paul's heartfelt conclusion to his letter to the Romans. After 15 chapters of deep Theology, he shifts to practical community. The message is clear, the gospel advances through people working together. AIC Plainsview, since 11th January 1976 has grown and achieved the Purpose for which she was born by recognizing, appreciating and partnering with different groups to be where we are and achieve our purpose.

1. We have Valued Every Contributor vs. 1-2; 3-16.

AIC Plainsview formerly known as AIC west, AIC south A valued contribution from everybody the Lord led to the Church. The Church tapped their Skills, their talents, their giftedness, their exposure, their positioning and involved them in the ministry. We commended them. Look at Paul in this passage. Paul opens by commending Phoebe, "a servant of the church at Cencreae," and urges the Romans to "receive her in the Lord" and "help her in whatever she may need from you." He then greets over 25 individuals and households by name. Notice who he highlights: Priscilla and Aquila, his "fellow workers in Christ Jesus," who "risked their necks" for him. Mary, "who has worked hard for you." Junia, "well known to the apostles." Tryphena, Tryphosa, and Rufus's mother. What names do you think the Lord comments in AIC Plainsview? Enabling ministry means seeing and honoring the everyday believers- especially those behind the scenes-whose work makes the church function. Partnership starts with recognition. Today we recognize the founders who have gone to be with the Lord and those that are alive today. God used you and we recognize you. No wonder The common Chorus, "we are together again."

2. Guard Unity and Truth vs. 17-20.

AIC Plainsview guards unity and Truth. We have tried to account for every- body and guard the Truth through serious sound Biblical teaching on the pulpit and in every department. Paul doesn't stop at encouragement. He warns: "watch out for those who cause divisions and create obstacles contrary to the doctrine that you have been taught; avoid them." True partnership requires discernment. We partner with those committed to the same gospel, not with those who divide or distort it. That's how we have grown. We have partnered with para-church organizations and other same mission minded organizations.

3. Keep the Gospel Central vs. 25-27.

AIC Plainsview has maintained and kept the gospel central and core business that is in South B and beyond. Paul closes with praise: "to the only wise God be glory forevermore through Jesus Christ!" The reason for all this partnership is the "mystery" now revealed-the gospel of Jesus Christ for "all nations."

These, Ministries are enabled when we:

- A. Welcome and support partners like Phoebe, giving them authority and resources of which Plainsview has done. We have tapped resources from the people God has brought to us from within and beyond the Church walls.
- B. Celebrate diverse gifts across gender, status, and background, just as Paul did in a church that crossed social divides, even reaching into Caesar's household.
- C. Stand united on truth while working together on our mission and vision. Each ministry is geared towards training men of God for works of service.
- D. When we realize that the gospel was never meant for anyone to travel alone. There must be a partnership that recognizes diverse gifts, talents and blessedness. Romans 16 shows us God's pattern: many hands, one mission, all for His glory. May God bless you as you discover your place, space, spot and area of specialization that God wants to use for reaching out South B and beyond. Amen

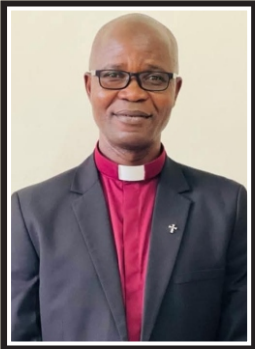
A brief history of the church.



AIC Plainsview is as a result of the ministry of the larger AIC Nairobi. AIC Nairobi of 1960s and 70s was composed of three congregations: AIC Ziwani, AIC Jericho and AIC Embakasi. AIC Thika was born around the same time. In the mid-70s, AIC Ziwani experienced numerical growth that burst its boundaries. It was the only existing congregation covering one of the largest areas of Eastleigh, Pangani, Mathare, Pumwani, Shauri Moyo, Park Road and Ngara, Kibera, all of Mariakani and Nairobi West and environs. Coming late to the service was not an option. People pushed to get in after services. I recall some near accident incidences as people rushing in to find a seat. Those were the good old days of growth. This painted several pictures: the hunger for the word of God, that the preaching was attractive, and that it pointed the need for space.

The above scenario moved some people to look for alternative space. Land surveyor Henry Wambua, (bachelor at the time) who was resident in Nairobi West at the time, with a few others started a Bible study. Later the families of Evans and Mary Mahia, with others joined. I remember coming to the Bible study at some point as a student from Scott Theological College (now Scott Christian University). Dr. Muoka and his household provided the garage for meeting place and a Sunday school space in the backyard. Having a service in a home and at the garage was a different feeling. Henry Wambua and Dr. Dunkerton were released from AIC Ziwani to kick start AIC Nairobi west. Henry with his guitar led the worship and Rev. Dunkerton managed the preaching. Student pastors were assigned to the Sunday services. Rev. Dr. Daniel Mwilu (Scott student at the time.) and others including myself served the then AIC Nairobi West occasionally. Nelson Wambua, Philip Ndolo, Land economist David Masika and others were key.

Partnership concept to spiritual/ numerical growth. As the congregation grew and members realized the need for a permanent place, this current plot was identified. It was the contractors' storage. Through the efforts of the Regional Church Council and Henry Wambua, the plot was secured and handed to AIC South A. By the time some of us were assigned here, the name had changed to AIC Plainsview in uniformity to the estate. AIC PV, lived on borrowed services for a long time. Rev. Dr. Samuel Nagi (from AIC Jericho) was among the very first full time pastors. Part of the team at the time were Rev. Dr. Mbunga, Rev. Joash and Esther Mutua, Rev. Dr. Kibwaa, and much later Prof. Agnes Makau, Rev. Dr. Samuel Linge to relieve Pastor Mwalwa. We praise God for allowing the pioneers to lay the foundation on Jesus' foundation. We thank God for the continued growth of the church with efficiency and effectiveness. Let them that continue this monumental work of God at AIC Plainsview do so with fear and trembling. May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the Love of God the Father and Fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all. Amen.

The organizational structure of Africa Inland Church Kenya provides a four-tier governance system of Church Councils the highest being the Central Church Council with the Local Church Council (LCC) at the congregational level.

The LCC at AIC Plainsview has seventeen (17) elected leaders (Elders) and two (2) pastors with the Senior/Pastor In charge as the Chairman of the Local Church Council. The Council has a Vice Chairperson, a Secretary, a Treasurer and an Assistant Treasurer, all drawn from the elected members.

The local Church Council works closely with an eighteen (18) member Local Church Women Committee and twelve (12) deacons to oversee the day-to-day operations of the local church, provide spiritual guidance to members, and ensure proper resources management and the implementation of the church policies and programs.

Under the leadership of our able LCC Chairman, Rev. Stanley Mulinge Mutangili assisted by Rev. Elijah Musau and the entire Church Leadership inter alia, the LCC, the LCWC and the entire congregation, AIC Plainsview launched the Jubilee Celebrations on 11th January, 2026 in a simple but elaborate way, thanking God for the fifty years the Church has existed. A reflection on the Church's humble beginning at a garage in a congregant's house, later moving into an inherited banda, and now the current Church, there is every reason to give all the glory to God.

In this space, it is also with great humility that we recognize the great works done by the founders and our partners in the ministry, the missionaries and the previous Local Church Councils. BUILDING FOR GENERATIONS:

AIC Plainsview's Five-Year Development Vision Takes Shape

"Go to the mountain and bring wood and build the temple..." – Haggai 1:8
AIC Plainsview continues to demonstrate its commitment to excellence in ministry, stewardship, and service through an ambitious Five-Year Development Plan designed to transform the church facilities and strengthen its ability to serve both current and future generations.

Led by the Building & Grounds (B&G) Committee, a dedicated team of church members undertook a comprehensive review of the church's infrastructure needs. Through consultation, prioritization, and strategic planning, the committee developed a phased development roadmap valued at approximately KSh 34 million.

Honoring the Foundation

The committee began its work by acknowledging and appreciating the contributions of previous church leadership and earlier Building & Grounds committees whose efforts laid the foundation upon which the current vision is being built.

Following a detailed assessment of church needs, projects were categorized into priority groups and aligned within a structured five-year implementation framework.

The Five-Year Vision

The development plan focuses on enhancing worship experience, improving security, modernizing facilities, expanding ministry support spaces, and creating a welcoming environment for the congregation and community.

Year 1 projects: Sanctuary and Compound Enhancement

All projects are completed ahead of time

Key projects include:

- Roof and gutter repairs
- Altar area modifications and flooring improvements
- Installation of modern LED church screens
- Security enhancements including CCTV and lighting upgrades
- Expansion of the church exit gate
- Construction of privacy screening walls
- Landscaping improvements
- Cabro paving of the parking area
- Development of a waste management area

These projects are aimed at improving both the functionality and aesthetics of the church compound while enhancing safety and accessibility.

Year 2: Worship Experience and Comfort

This phase focuses on creating a more effective worship environment through:

- Modern PA and livestreaming systems
- Church cooling systems- Completed
- Reliable power backup solutions- Completed
- Renovation of men's washrooms- Completed

- Completion of a modern church kitchen- Completed
- Sanctuary ceiling enhancement - Completed

These investments are intended to improve sound quality, congregation comfort, and ministry reach through digital platforms.

Year 3: Ministry Support Facilities

Estimated Cost: KSh 5.95 Million

Projects include:

- Construction of a Nursing Mothers' Room
- Creation of a dedicated boardroom
- Pulpit enhancement

These facilities will support ministry operations while providing greater convenience for church members and visitors.

Year 4: CED Block Completion

Estimated Cost: KSh 4.5 Million

The Children's Education Department (CED) facilities remain a strategic priority.

Planned works include:

- Completion of interior finishes
- Painting works
- Entrance enhancement and beautification

The improvements will provide a conducive learning environment for children and ministry workers.

Year 5: Church Transportation

A proposed 51-seater church bus, estimated at KSh 8.5 million, will support outreach, mission activities, conferences, and congregation transportation needs.

Celebrating Year One Successes

Following approval by the Local Church Council (LCC) and commissioning by the congregation, the church successfully completed its first-year projects, demonstrating strong commitment and faithful stewardship of resources.

These achievements have provided confidence and momentum for the next phase of development.

Year Two: Focus on the Sanctuary

For the 2025–2026 period, the church has embarked on a major sanctuary improvement program valued at approximately KSh 10.35 million.

Funding and Sustainability

The committee has emphasized a responsible and sustainable implementation approach through:

- Phased project execution
- Annual budgeting
- Competitive tendering
- Quarterly project reviews
- Preventive maintenance planning
- Training of support personnel

In addition, members are encouraged to participate through the "Adopt a Project" initiative, allowing individuals, families, and groups to directly support specific development projects.

The Five-Year Development Plan is more than a construction program; it is an investment in ministry, discipleship, worship, and future generations.

As the church continues its journey, members are encouraged to:

- Pray for the vision
- Support ongoing projects
- Provide constructive feedback

Together, the congregation is building facilities that will serve God's people for many years to come.
