of His will**

**Bearing fruit
in every work**

Paul's letter to the Colossians opens with a profound prayer for spiritual growth. In Colossians 1:9-10, he establishes a divine sequence: receiving knowledge of God's will leads directly to bearing fruit in every good work.

"For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of His will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please Him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God."

— Colossians 1:9-10 (NIV)

Theological Foundation

In Colossians 1:9-10, Paul presents a deliberate spiritual sequence: knowledge of God's will precedes and enables fruitful living. This is not coincidental — it reflects the divine order of spiritual development.

Understanding these two foundational concepts is essential to grasping Paul's prayer and its implications for Christian discipleship and growth.



Knowledge: Spiritual understanding, wisdom & revelation of God's will



Fruitfulness: Evidence of spiritual growth & Christ-centred living



Sequence: Knowledge precedes & empowers fruitfulness





Knowledge: Spiritual insight & understanding God's will



Knowledge: Foundation that enables intentional, obedient action



Fruitfulness: Evidence of growth, Christian living & transformation

The Significance of Sequence

In Colossians 1:9-10, Paul reveals a divine order: knowledge precedes fruitfulness. This sequence is not incidental — it is foundational to authentic spiritual growth and sustainable Christian living.

Understanding why this order matters transforms how we approach discipleship, obedience, and our walk with God.

1. Maturity needs knowledge first

2. Fruitfulness without knowledge is shallow

3. Knowledge motivates obedience

4. Sequential growth is sustainable

Assess Your Spiritual Sequence

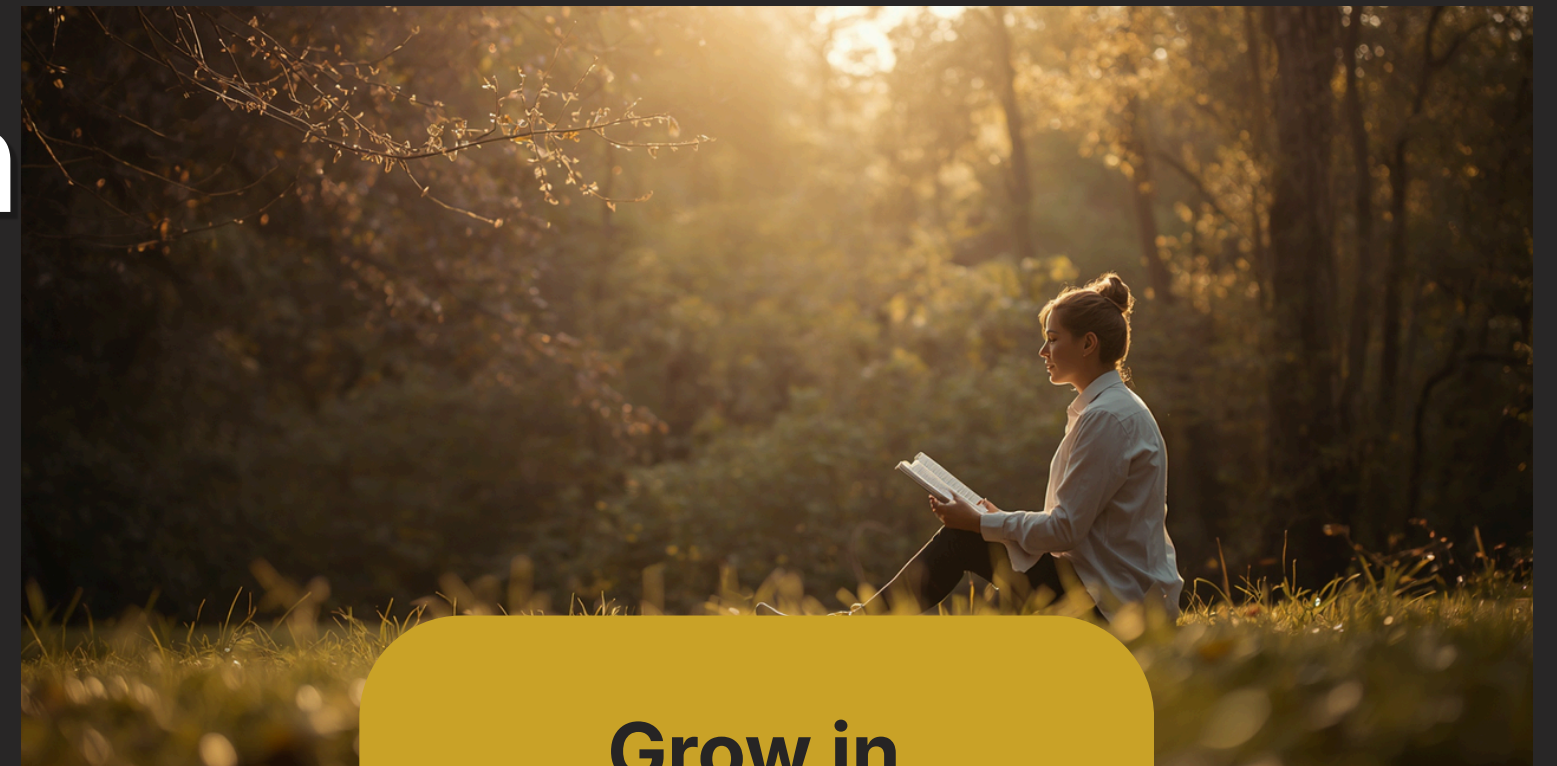
Are you growing in knowledge before fruitfulness? Take a moment to reflect:
